Naplan testing.

Our year 3, 5 and 7 students completed the Naplan tests last week. These tests give staff a snapshot of what students know and can do at a certain point in time. Used as a diagnostic tool staff can identify areas that students need further support with.

Pet Visit

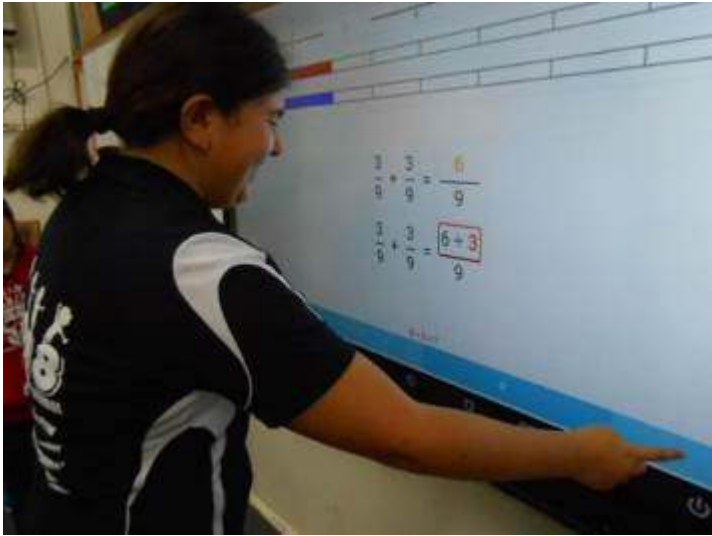


YP Vets brought some animals to our school on Wednesday. Some were fluffy and some were not! (Look at Chelsea's face)
