We are looking forward to the children slowly returning and we hope to have everyone back on board next week.

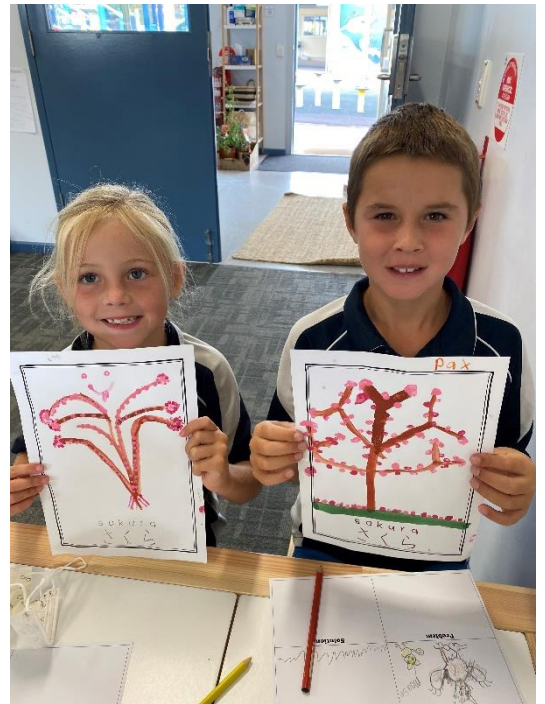


## SEAHORSE NEWS
