1. POLICY OBJECTIVES

In accordance with the Education Act 1972 and Regulation 86, SPS has determined school uniform requirements through a consultative process. This policy sets out the guidelines and arrangements for school uniform requirements across the SPS community.

Students need to present themselves in a manner, which indicates that they are at school for the purpose of learning.

2. POLICY SCOPE

The benefits of students wearing a uniform include:

- Encouraging a sense of belonging and pride in our school through a cohesive identity.
- Reduces competition relating to clothing and fashion.
- Prepares students for possible future employment situations.
- Increased security for SPS students to easily identify outside intruders (both onsite and offsite).

Role of SPS staff and teachers

- Encourage and promote students to comply with uniform policy guidelines.
- Notify families and students when school uniforms are not required on particular days.
- Provide a small stock of hats and beanies, as these are easily lost and are required for the students to be able to participate in the curriculum.
- Where possible, work together with families to assist in meeting the school uniform requirements.

Role of parents /carers

- Support SPS staff and students in complying with uniform policy guidelines.
- Provide advice and communication to SPS staff when compliance with uniform policy guidelines is not possible.
- Ensure all uniforms are clearly named, so misplaced items can be easily returned.

Dress code guidelines

- School uniform must be worn to school on a daily basis and offsite functions where students are representing SPS (e.g. assemblies, sports days, community events).

- Uniforms can be purchased from the SYP Surf & Sports store (located at 13 Warooka Road in Yorketown).
- Acceptable outer wear and dress code guidelines include:
 - Official navy school polo shirt, blue jumper and zip up jacket
 - Navy or dark coloured (no denim) trousers, track pants, shorts, skorts or skirts
 - Poly cotton navy check dress
 - Suitable and comfortable dark or white enclosed footwear for students
 - Navy bucket hats are required to be worn in accordance with the sun safe policy
 - In colder weather navy beanies, navy scarves or navy gloves/mittens may be worn outside
 - Bike shorts are to be worn only for sports events
- On casual days learners are to abide by our sun safe policy of covered shoulders, which includes no mid tops and reasonable length shorts or skirts, and wear appropriate footwear.
- It is expected that when students are representing the school at official, formal, offsite functions / activities or photographs, students will maintain all outerwear in the modest school navy, dark blue tones (including footwear) and be in a neat and tidy manner including hair style, footwear and minimal jewellery.

3. POLICY REVIEW TIMEFRAME

This policy will be reviewed and updated every three (3) years or as deemed necessary in consideration of any changes to legislation and relevant standards, codes and guidelines.
